The Albany is a prestigious West End comedy venue, having hosted alternative entertainment, comedy and cabaret since the late '80s. It was the birthplace of nights like Spank! and Robin Ince's Book Club, and was picked by Bob Monkhouse for The Last Stand, his final gig, filmed for the BBC. These days it is home to myriad comedy shows, as well as Objectively Funny Festival in September.

The stage is downstairs in a shabby-chic basement room that holds 90 at a push, or 50 with cabaret seating. It is a raised platform with a large backstage space covered by black curtains. The room is professionally lit and has excellent audio capabilities.

There is a bar downstairs that can be staffed depending on the numbers that each show will bring in.

Use of the space will cost a non-refundable deposit of £10 per performance Sunday-Thursday, and £20 on Friday and Saturday.

The venue is most suitable for comedy but we are open to programming simple theatre shows. The Albany is available throughout the Camden Fringe, from the 30th July - 26th August.
